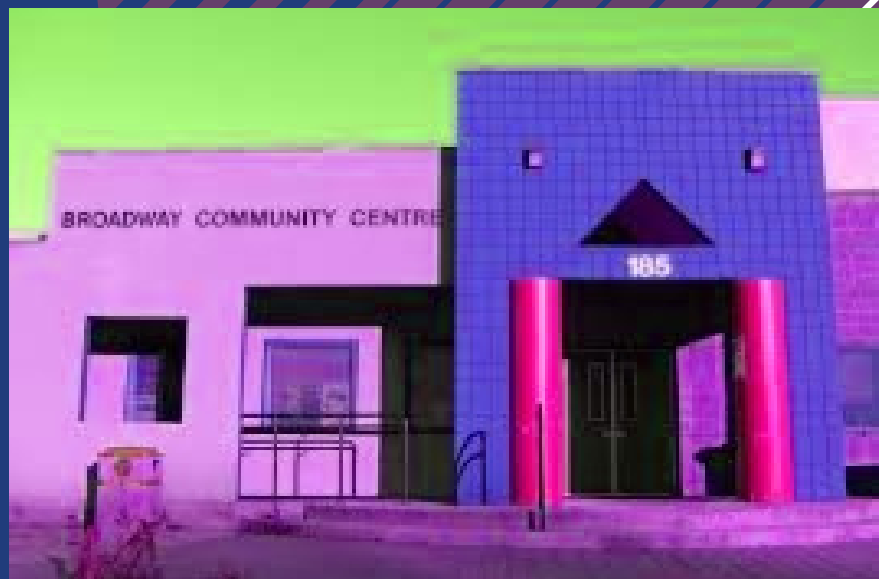

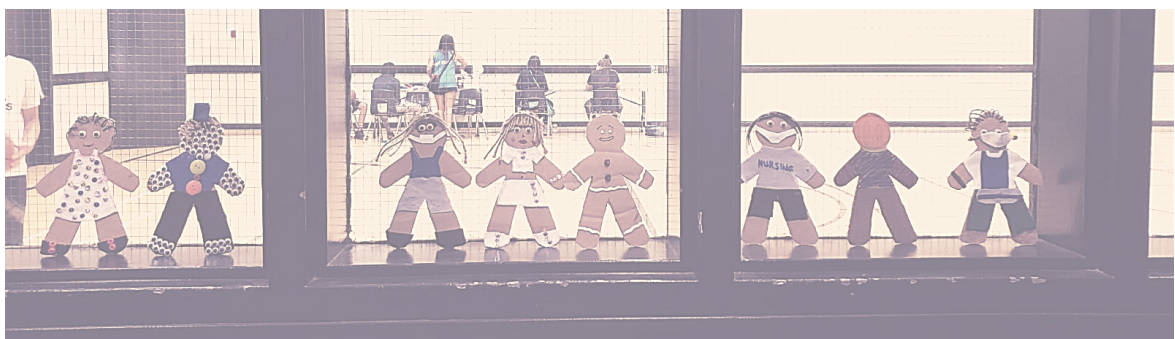


MISSION STATEMENT

REGARDS FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD

In drafting these remarks for our AGM, I can certainly say this feels much, much different than any of my previous years on the Board of the BNC!

How to begin? This year has thrown us all so many challenges and trying to sum up 2020 from any perspective seems like an incredible challenge. This pandemic has thrown the entire world for a loop, and the BNC is no different.

Much like the rest of our city, province and country, the arrival of the pandemic in March required us to immediately shut down, at least regarding our regular operations. Normal wasn't going to exist anymore (at least for a while), and every aspect of life at the BNC had to shift dramatically. However, Spatch and our incredible team were up to the challenge.

They moved immediately to reach out to all of our partners, funders, volunteers, vendors and students to communicate the temporary closure and next steps. They took steps necessary to minimize the cost disruptions that were going to occur, while maintaining core staffing levels.

They also moved swiftly to ensure the organization as well as our employees were all connected to available supports as they were announced throughout the year. Likewise with Just TV, the transition to remote work was already in place by mid-March.

Laura and the team all worked tirelessly to ensure continuity for all of our participants, shifting focus to remote video and music creation, while continuing to provide the crucial direct support for everyone to keep going.

Given the role of the BNC as a true neighbourhood centre, Spatch and Jackie immediately stepped up to continue to serve the neighbourhood and broader community, even if we were temporarily shut down at 185 Young.

Through partnerships with the Westminster Church / Bell Tower Harvest Program, as well as the Community Harvest Food Bank, food hampers were constantly supplied to those community members in need. Likewise, through partnership with Ma Mawi Wi Chi Itata Centre, Spatch was out delivering groceries 6 days a week to the West Broadway and Central communities.

As we slowly inch towards something that feels more normal, we are continually reminded that the BNC remains a crucial part of the community, regardless of what may be going on with the state of the world.

I also want to thank everyone who served on our Board again this year. Your continued support through all of this was crucial to the survival of the BNC. We are endlessly appreciative for our numerous donors and funding partners and donors who ensure that the BNC continues to play such a key part in this thriving neighbourhood.

Thanks to all of you for continuing to support and engage with the BNC. We look forward to another memorable year with all of you! - Michael Jack

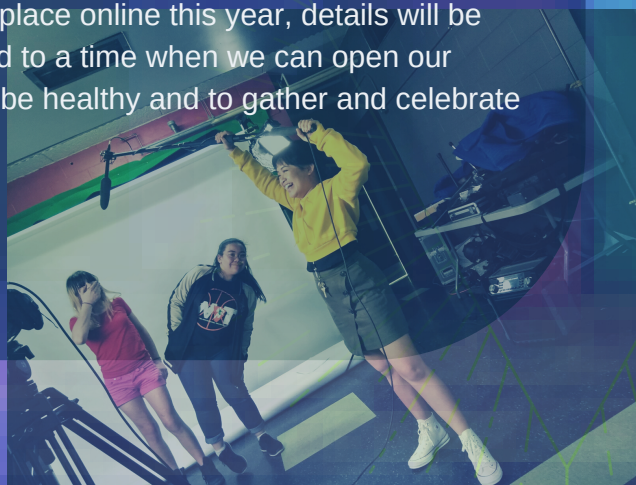

At the BNC it is a common goal across the programs we offer to help our younger generation attain their goals, growing towards becoming contributing members of their community and society. From volunteer opportunities, to Rotary Leaders, Apprenticeship, training, post-secondary assistance and employment. The Just TV and BNC staff work with our young people to see them through the different stages of their growth and development. Through several summer grants opportunities, we have the ability to provide full-time and part time employment at the Centre opening the door for new employees and returning employee's to sustain gainful employment. Over the years, many of the participants attending our programs have had the chance to gain their first work experience right here in a place they have made their second home.

ULTIMATE GOAL:

Engaging and empowering Indigenous Youth in intensive cultural exploration

BRIEF PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Touch the Earth Program stemmed from our popular Turtle Teachings Program beginning in 2014. It has continued over the past 7 years.

Provide youth the opportunity to experience Indigenous ceremony and culture: This component will provide participants with the opportunity to learn ancient Indigenous knowledge and teachings from respected Elders and community leaders. As youth gain a stronger knowledge of their identity, they will develop the skills and confidence to become strong community leaders. This component will provide Indigenous youth with:

- Connection to Elders and Community Leaders
- Opportunities for healing from intergenerational trauma by reconnecting to their culture
- Opportunities to apply the teachings into their everyday lives
- Education of ancient knowledge in hopes they will carry it forward
- Activities include: sweat lodge, medicine pouches, rattles, medicine teachings and picking, building sweat lodge, pipe ceremony, naming ceremony, water ceremony, exploring bundles, attending the Turtle Lodge, debrief sharing circles, 7 Sacred Teachings.





GIRLS GROUP

The Girls Group Program is now in its 11th year , there are 15 participants , many who have returned over the years and a few new participants. The girls were able to attend 27 workshops this year and 32 outings. All geared towards their interests and their personal growth and development.

A number of University student leaders and High school student volunteers have been brought into the Girls Group Network as a method to expose them to a variety of options for education and career paths. They are received as positive role models for the younger girls by actively teaching them new skills and providing learning opportunities.



The Neighbourhood Centre provides a stable and safe area for the girls grow as individuals and as a healthy and connected group of young females. An emphasis is placed on positive influence, active participation in community and activities, healthy relationships and acceptance of others. We encourage reflection steered towards finding the beauty in being unique, embracing each other's difference in personality and appearance.

New Ventures & Partnerships

Sustainability

In 2019 we began a new venture with The Winnipeg foundation and Green Action Centre, it started with a waste Audit conducted by The BNC Earth Team and Josep the sustainability project Coordinator from Green Action Centre...we learned a lot over a very stinky process.... The message was clear from our young Earth Team...we need to have better recycling habits, composting habits and send less waste to the landfills!!!! That's not all Green Action Centre brought in Mark Ranson to look at the building and how we can make adjustments to be operating cost effectively with less pollution omission from the building itself from electricity, to water and heating. With education, training, action and participation. We aim to change our practices, educate the youth and staff and make adaptations to our building; become leaders in change and moving towards a sustainable future for the next generation.

Bear Clan West Broadway Den

In 2019 we entered into a new partnership venture with the West Broadway branch of Bear Clan. Since this partnership ensued the Broadway Neighbourhood Centre has become the Bear clan Den for this area of the City. From youth walks to evening patrol, The Broadway Neighbourhood Centre youth participants staff have joined in to become fully immersive in this new experience. Giving them another layer of understanding with the community the youth live and work in.



KIDS COOKING NOURISHING POTENTIAL

THE BNC *kitchen*

This year the Nourishing Potential grant allowed us to train 20 community members, employees and youth to attain their Safe Food Handlers Certification and re-fit the BNC kitchen with much needed kitchen Equipment. Along with last years 2019 West Broadway Small Grants we were able to get new much needed Roasters and cooking supplies.

All our other funding went to sustain our weekly kids cooking classes!

Our staff and educational professionals know first hand the positive effects a nutritious lunch can have on a child's ability to learn. That is why The BNC saw the need to launch the Fuel 4 school program. Since the inception of the program our response from the participating schools had been a positive one. With the help of the staff and volunteers, youth learn about making healthy choices and are guaranteed to have nutritious lunch for the next school day!

Not only are inner city children getting good quality meals throughout the day they are building social skills and healthy participation in their learning.

Hungry children cannot concentrate on schoolwork, physical activity or social engagement. They are often, tired, distracted, lethargic and poorly focused. This can simply cause a tendency to act out in sheer frustration. For a significant number of inner city children, the fuel 4 school program has grown substantially over the years with over 8,160 lunches made last year alone! With warm meals served from the centre we reached 51,770! We actively believe in aiding the cause to eliminate local hunger starting with serving our younger demographic and feeding our future.
